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## INTRODUCTION

The modules on which End of Year processes are performed in Triumph Business Systems fall into three categories –

1. General Ledger;
2. \*Other Modules; and
3. Sales Analysis.

(\*Other modules include Debtors, Creditors, Inventory, Fixed Assets, and Job Costing.)

Each of these categories is dealt with differently. It is important to know what is happening when you close/rollover your modules to ensure that the appropriate actions are taken for each module. As Triumph Accounting allows you to process transactions into future periods, there is normally no greater urgency to close off the end of the financial year than there is at the end of any other month. With the close of a financial year, another “chapter” in the story of the organisation comes to an end. Before closing the chapter there is an opportunity to ensure that the contents of the chapter (transactions and balances) tell the correct story for the year.

### *Other Modules*

For Other Modules, end of year [EOY] processing carries out the same functions as end of month (clears month-to date/period-to-date balances and puts them into “last month/period”) and in addition clears year-to-date balances and puts them into “last year” for comparison purposes. The other major function is to re-align the ageing, moving current balances to 30 days, 30 days to 60 days, and so on. Balances previously treated as being “Future” (i.e., dated in advance of then current period) are also re-aligned to include the appropriate transactions in the “new” current period.

**Do not run End of Month for the last month [normally 30 June] prior to End of Year.** The End of Year process replaces the End of Month process for the final month of your financial year in all modules.

### *Sales Analysis*

Sales Analysis is rolled over only once each year. Sales Analysis records are contained in a single file and are filed strictly by date. Any records, predated to the prior year, entered after the end of year rollover, will be recorded in the New Year.

### *General Ledger*

The start of the new financial year is the best time to make changes to your chart of accounts or any other code changes. Please call us if you would like help.

When the General Ledger is closed and rolled over for the year the transactions dated in the previous year are erased. It is essential therefore to make an ARCHIVE of the year before rolling over the End of Year. It is also critical to take a backup, perhaps more than one, at various stages of the processes.

## BACKUP

The MOST CRITICAL part of the End of Year process is taking a BACKUP. Preferably this should be done at various stages during the End of Year process. Mention will be made as we progress through these notes of key points for backing up.

**You may have several “End of Year backups”.**

**THE BACKUPS YOU TAKE AT END OF YEAR SHOULD BE CLEARLY LABELLED AND RETAINED INDEFINITELY IN A VERY SAFE PLACE, PREFERABLY SEPARATED FROM THE TRIUMPH SERVER.**

Once your system is rolled over to the new financial year, your backup may be the last chance of getting back the 2025/2026 financial year information. If you are processing your Debtors, Creditors, General Ledger at different times, you will need to do a backup **PRIOR** to completing End of Year for each module. They should be labelled EOY Debtors & Inventory, EOY Creditors etc.

In the following procedures we have included how to create a complete copy of your system prior to EOY rollover in General Ledger so you can easily switch to another company to access last year’s information. This is especially useful if you still wish to print detailed ledger listings for your accountant etc. It should be noted this does not replace a backup done to removable media such as CD, flash-drive, or cloud backup etc., which is the only way to protect yourself in the event of a hard disk crash, theft, or encryption.

If you are not running General Ledger, it is still recommended you carry out the “Copying the Company” procedures found in the General Ledger section below (Page 29). See also the section on ‘**Completing the Financial Year**’ and the impact of the “Copy Company” on the timing of your End of Year procedures.

The following instructions incorporate end of month procedures and any specific year end requirements. They include the most commonly run reports and processes. Should these differ from your existing procedures please give us a call and discuss the reasons for these differences. Some screens may differ slightly depending on modules purchased or version being used eg., Multi-division/ Multi-location, and v6.3, v6.2, v6.1 to v6.0 etc.

We have assumed a year end date of 30 June 2026. If your year end is not 30 June 2026, please change the references to this date throughout this document accordingly.

## HOUSEKEEPING

**Note: These procedures should also be followed for End of Month. It is preferable that Housekeeping is carried out in advance of your “appointment” for running End of Year. This way any issues which need to be addressed, such as updates to Windows or Triumph, or data cleansing found during housekeeping, can be attended to without undue interference to normal operations.**

Before commencing End of Year procedures, it is recommended you carry out some ‘housekeeping’. This prevents the situation where the rollover may be unsuccessful because of corrupt data which would necessitate a restore if found after the rollover has commenced.

Run a health check on your system (see summary page 37). Ensure reports are balanced to their general ledger control accounts.

To run the housekeeping procedures, you will need all other users to be logged out of Triumph and the system switched to Single User mode. Depending on the size of your database, they may take some time to complete, so make sure you start them at a time which will allow you to complete them with minimum inconvenience to other users.

Check to see whether Windows on the server is up to date and that you are running the latest Triumph version of your build. Your IT person should be scheduling Windows updates and rebooting your server monthly and backing up your Triumph data nightly. Install any Triumph updates after the server has been rebooted and run the update with full administrator rights.

Some sites have Dataflex web applications installed for eCommerce, API, inventory scanning etc. These should be turned off temporarily while any maintenance is carried out.

### *Validate your data.*

To run this function, ensure all users are out of Triumph and have closed the Triumph log in screen.

Log out back to the windows desktop and Double click on your Triumph Validation icon. If you have no icon, go to the START button and select PROGRAMS-TRIUMPH ACCOUNTING FOR WINDOWS-VALIDATE TRIUMPH. Select workspace (if necessary) and “all companies”. If you have a message reporting, “errors trapped”, these errors must be sorted out before continuing. The result should be a screen with all your companies listed and “passed” or “no validation required” after each.

**If there is no icon to run this function, or the comment after any company is other than “PASSED”, contact the help desk for advice.**

*Re-index your data* (not required for SQL). Log back into Triumph, then place the system into single user by clicking the access button on the toolbar.

To re-index (screen S-D-I): System Maintenance > Data base management > Re-Index Company/ Database

### *Complete Integrity Checks.*

Integrity checks of your data can only be run individually from each module. After the re-index, keep your system in **SINGLE** user mode for this process.

This function is specific to each module and must be run from each Module's menu:

➤ Run by Module:

- General Ledger {G - S - C}
- Debtors {D - S - C}
- Creditors {C - S - C}
- Inventory {I - S - C}
- Job Costing {J - S - C}
- Fixed Assets {F - S - C}

➤ Validate Chart of Accounts {G - S - V} to make sure that any chart of account changes are valid and that end of year profits will carry forward to the balance sheet.

In the event you have any error/"corrupt" messages after any of these procedures contact our help desk and ask for advice on how to check your data before you proceed.

### *Check for unbalanced transactions –*

General Ledger > Reports > GL Event Reference Report {G-R-E}:

If you find unbalanced transactions on that report then fix them (single user mode) General Ledger > Special Processing > Extra Special Options > Check for Unbalanced Transactions {G-S-X-U}.

If you are not familiar with the process to fix unbalanced transactions phone or email to our Phone Support desk to work through the implications. It is not a lengthy process but getting it right is important.


### **Take a backup of your data. Go to System Maintenance > Database Management > Transfer Company > Transfer Out {S-D-T-O}**

Follow the prompts and ensure the correct company is selected. Save the backup in a location that makes it easy to determine. Add a DESCRIPTION to highlight what the backup is for in case a restore is required. Leave all other information as the default on this screen.

As a precaution we also highly recommend performing a copy company **in addition** to any other database backup. You will need to keep a final copy company for the year 23/24 when you roll over your general ledger (see page 36), but it is also recommended to keep a recent copy company before performing rollovers for the other modules. Name them appropriately.

**Note to SQL users:** If the database type being used is SQL, then you will need to do a manual SQL backup prior to end of year module rollovers. Speak to your systems administrator on how to perform a SQL backup.

## Copy Company



Go to System Maintenance > Database Management > Copy Company {S-D-C}

- Type in the Folder Name e.g., comp2024
- Select Copy Type – Complete Company

When a backup company is no longer required, it can be removed {S - D – R} Remove a Company. Ensure you are logged into your main, active, company when you remove other databases – you can't remove a company that you are logged into, so it's a safeguard to make sure you are removing the archive company rather than your live data.

### Close any finalised months

When you have completed your transactions for the year, you need not rollover the General Ledger yet. But you are advised to lock off transactions to the prior year.

Within Triumph, the subsidiary ledgers have the flexibility of being able to process in a different period to the General Ledger. e.g., You could have your General Ledger system in July 2025 and the subsidiary ledgers (Debtors, Creditors, and Inventory) posting period could have their posting period set to May 2026. This means that transactions from subsidiary ledgers can only be posted to the General Ledger from May2024 onwards and General Ledger transactions can be posted back to July 2025.

The posting period indicators determine where both General Ledger and subsidiary ledger transactions are to be posted. When subsidiary modules are closed for End of Year, ensure no further transactions from the subsidiary modules (Debtors, Creditors, Inventory, Job Costing, etc.) are posted back into the prior year General Ledger. To do this, move the Slides for the Subsidiary Modules down to July 2024, or later – refer to screen shot on previous page.

## BANK RECONCILIATION

### End of Year Procedures

After all bank statements are entered for the month a reconciliation report should be printed showing that there is no discrepancy between the Bank Reconciliation and the General Ledger.

The procedure for this is as follows:

#### 1. Bank Reconciliation Report {G - B - S - R}

- Statement Totals Only
- Transactions Outstanding Transactions
- Financial Period 12

On this report you should investigate any outstanding payments older than expected, and any other outstanding amounts older than a week.

It is very important to print the reconciliation for period 12 at this point as this cannot be printed once you have done your rollover. Should you find you have omitted to print this report (required by your accountant in completing tax returns, etc. a Crystal Report can be purchased which will enable you to extract the required information. Ask one of our consultants for details.

The reconciliation report and other reports on this page should be run for each bank account maintained by the business.

The following reports should then be printed:

## *2. Bank Transaction Register {G - B - R - C}*

### a) Type: Payment

- Options: Transaction Type All Transactions
- Financial Period Current Period
- Group By Entry Sequence
- Selections Keep all Defaults

Check this report thoroughly for any cheques that have not been entered into Triumph. The only cheques not appearing in this report will be cancelled cheques. Confirm this before proceeding.

### b) Type: Deposit

- Options: Transaction Type Deposits
- Financial Period Current Period
- Group By Bank Account
- Selections Keep all defaults

There is no actual end of month procedure for Bank Reconciliation as this is automatically included in the following General Ledger procedure however it is very important, particularly at year end, to ensure that your bank reconciliation contains no discrepancies.

### *Check all reconcilable accounts*

If an account that is reconciled periodically (e.g., Savings accounts or Credit Cards) is partially reconciled at time of General Ledger End of Year, the General Ledger End of Year will not process. This is true even if the current reconciliation in process is current and the end of year process has long been finalised.

## DEBTORS

**Note: These procedures are also followed for End of Month. Roll Debtors only after you have produced your last debtor invoice for the year and receipted your last receipt for the year, if this is possible.**

### *Debtor End of Year Procedures*

Ensure all invoices AND receipts for the month have been entered and a **backup** has been completed, then print the following reports and confirm the balances.

We strongly recommend that reports with '\*' be saved or printed as these cannot necessarily be recreated post rollover. They can be saved as PDFs in created folders specific to Triumph EOY.

#### 1. *Bad Debts*

Ensure any bad debts are written off prior to commencing the end of year process. Use debtors credit notes with a GL line (to the General Ledger code for Bad Debts) to recover any GST which has been collected and paid when recording the original sale.

#### 2. *Debtor Batch Invoice Entry* – Review any held Batch Invoices {D-T-B Batch Invoice Entry Lookup} to ensure invoices that belong in the current year are posted and that any invoices held back are dated into the new year.

#### 3. \* *Debtors Unallocated Credits {D - R - P - U} Report*

- Options: Financial Period All
- Group by Transaction Number
- Leave all selections as first to last

Anything that appears on this report should be checked carefully. This report may indicate receipts that have not been allocated to invoices correctly. If any errors are found, they should be corrected before proceeding.

#### 4. \* *Debtor in Credit Report {D - R - C}*

- Options: Ageing Type All
- Ageing Period Leave as default
- Report Date 30 June 2026
- List Transactions Yes
- Group by Debtor Code (Transaction Number)
- Selections tab Leave all selections as unticked

This report will also highlight any receipts that have been posted to incorrect debtors. This report should be checked, and any errors corrected before proceeding.

#### 5. \* *Debtors Aged Trial Balance {D - R - B}*

Summary

- Options: Ageing type - All
- Ageing period All Periods
- Report Date - 30 June 2026

- Leave all other defaults

Ensure the grand total on this report agrees to balance of General Ledger Debtor Control Account before continuing. Report printed in summary format initially in case further adjustments are to be made.

#### 6. *Debtors Sales Statistics {D - R - S}*

- Options: Sales Comparison - Last Year and Year to Date
- Group By Debtor Code
- Selections: Keep all Defaults

#### 7. *Debtors Trial Balance {D - R - B}*

- Options: Ageing type All
- Ageing period All Periods
- Report Date 30 June 2026
- Leave all other defaults
- Include Transactions Click dropdown and select Yes
- Include Contact Tick for debt collection purposes
- Detailed report to be saved/printed after final adjustments as a hard copy.

#### 8. \* *Debtor Transaction Registers - Sales {D - R - P - R}*

- Transaction Type Sale
- Financial Period **All**
- Options POS Transactions – Include (or print separately)
- Group by Transaction Number
- Selections Transaction Date – **1 June to 30 June**

#### 9. \* *Debtor Transaction Registers - Receipts {D - R - P - R}*

- Transaction Type Receipt
- Financial Period **All**
- Options POS Transactions – Include (or print separately)
- Group by Transaction Number
- Selections Transaction Date – **1 June to 30 June**

#### 10. \* *Debtor Transaction Registers - Journal {D - R - P - R}*

- Transaction Type Journal
- Financial Period **All**
- Options POS Transactions – Include (or print separately)
- Group by Transaction Number
- Selections Transaction Date – **1 June to 30 June**

#### 11. *Statement Production {D - S - S}*

- Options: Statement Message - Leave blank unless specific message to all Debtors
- Statement Date 30 June 2024
- Ageing Type All Ageing periods (untick Single Ageing Period)
- Ageing Period All (Greys out)
- Balances No zero balances
- Order by Debtor Code

- Selections: Keep all Defaults

### *12. Tax Register {D - R - T}*

- Options: Transaction Type: Sales
- Selections: BAS Report Covering last quarter of financial year

### *13. Outstanding Sales Order Report {D - O - R - O}*

The report should be run and checked to ensure all orders are up to date and not too old.

## INVENTORY

### Stock Take

If a Stock Take is to be conducted at the close of the year, it is very important your Stock Take is defined at the end of the last day of the year (30 June) and your physical Stock Take completed. Refer to Appendix A for directions on obtaining stock take procedures.

### Inventory End of Year Procedure

If your business is using the Purchase Order module you should run the following reports at the close of business 30<sup>th</sup> June 2026. The data underlying these reports is constantly changing as Purchase Orders are processed. A true comparison with the General Ledger "liability" accounts can only be guaranteed if the data is captured at close of business on 30<sup>th</sup> June.

Following reports with '\*' must be saved or printed.

#### 1 \* Purchase Registers Commitment \*{C - P - R - P} or for v5.1 {C - P - R - C}

- Options: Select the Commitment Type and no Options

This report should be reconciled against the Balance Sheet account for Purchase Order commitments.

#### 2. \* Purchase Registers Accrual \*{C - P - R - P} or for 5.1 {C - P - R - A}

- Options: Select the Accrual Type and no Options

This report should be reconciled against the Balance Sheet account for Purchase Order Accruals (amount accrued for goods received for which no invoice has yet been entered).

#### 3. \* Outstanding Order Report \*{C - P - R - O}

- Options: Outstanding Type Both
- Include Lines Yes
- Selections Keep all defaults

Check outstanding orders to determine whether any orders should be cancelled before proceeding with the Inventory rollover.

### Closing the Inventory Module

Reports to be printed include the following:

- Options: Financial Period All
- Group By Stock Code


This report should also be run with Sales Comparison as Year to Date v Last Year. It is also a useful report for checking that the 'GP%' column value for each item is reasonable.

3. \* Stock Valuation Report {I - R - V}

- Options: Valuation Period As at end of Period
- Costing Method Average (or current method being used)
- Optional Filter None Selected
- Include Graph not ticked
- Summarise Don't tick
- Group By Stock Code Subgroup by: None
- Selections Keep all defaults

This report should be checked to see that it agrees with both the Closing Stock and the Stock on Hand accounts in your General Ledger before you continue.

When the above reports have been printed you can proceed with the end of year processing for debtors and inventory.

If you receive errors (red writing) do not proceed with daily processing. Take note of the error received, restore from the backup file, and contact your consultant immediately to investigate.

Sales Analysis is connected to both Inventory and Debtors modules. It is treated separately in this document, however, as it has characteristics which are quite separate from those of the other sub-modules (non-General Ledger).

## CREDITORS

*Note: These procedures are also followed for End of Month  
Roll Creditors only after you have finalised your last purchase order goods receipts  
and creditor invoices/payments for the financial year.*

### End of Year Procedures

If Creditors end of year is being run at a different time than Debtors and Inventory, then a backup must be done before continuing. When all invoices and payments have been processed for the month, print the following reports:

Following reports with '\*' must be saved or printed.

1. *\*Creditor Batch Invoice {C-T-B}*

Ensure batch invoices are posted that belong to the current year.

Batch invoicing is a recent addition to the creditors module and is related to OCR scanning of creditors invoices into Triumph using a webapp. If are interested in this new feature, phone and ask for a demo.

2. *\*Parked invoices {C-P-R-K}*

Review the parked invoices to goods receive the stock before stocktake, and release those invoices into this year.

3. *\* Creditor Unallocated Debits {C - R - P - U}*

- Options: Financial Period All
- Group By Creditor Code
- Selections Keep all Defaults

This report will highlight any inconsistencies between creditor's invoices and payments and whether any payments have not been allocated correctly. Please clean up before proceeding.

4. *\* Creditor Trial Balance {C - R - B}*

- Ageing Type All Periods
- Ageing Type M
- Report Date 30 June 2026
- Include Graph Don't tick
- List Transactions Don't tick
- Include Last Payment Don't tick
- Group By Creditor Code
- Selections Keep all Defaults

Check that the total on this report agrees with the balance of the General Ledger Creditors Control Account before proceeding any further.

## FIXED ASSETS

### *End of Year Procedures*

If you are running Fixed Assets module integrated with the rest of your accounting modules, you should now carry out the following procedures to complete the end of year rollover for Fixed Assets.

Before proceeding with printing of reports check all transactions have been entered and depreciation has been processed up to the end of the financial year (30/06/2024). Reports to be printed may include the following:

#### *1. Capital Gains on Asset Sales {F - R - C}*

- Options: Group by asset code
- Financial Period: If a printed record is required for the whole year,

select Range and periods from 31 July 2023 to 30 June 2026.

Note: Capital Gains calculations may require the maintenance of the CPI Table {F – F – C}. If you are unsure as to how this feature should be applied discuss this with one of our consultants.

#### *2. Profit and Loss on Sales {F - R - L} of assets*

- Options: Group by asset code
- Financial Period: If a printed record is required for the whole year,

select Range and periods from 31 July 2023 to 30 June 2026.

#### *3. Depreciation Schedule {F - R - D}*

- Group by Asset Code
- Include components and select whether for Accounting or Taxation purposes.

Note that in many instances there will not be a separate depreciation process for Taxation.

Reconcile the depreciation calculated for the year per the Depreciation Schedule with the amounts charged as Depreciation Expense in the General Ledger.

#### *4. Asset Valuation Schedule {F - R - S}*

- Group by Asset Code
- Include components and select whether for Accounting or Taxation purposes.


Reconcile the closing Ledger Costs with the cost values of assets in the General Ledger and the Closing Depreciation under Ledger Provisions with the Accumulated Depreciation accounts in the General Ledger.

5. End of Period Processing {F - S - E} N.B. Triumph must be in single user mode

## SALES ANALYSIS

### *What is Sales Analysis*

Sales Analysis is being covered last on this document as it is “different: in only having an End of year (there are no month ends). Processes are therefore a little different.

Sales Analysis Module stores transactions from both Debtors and Inventory into a single data set. Reports can therefore be extracted from both Debtors and Inventory and combined and analysed jointly. This makes Sales Analysis a very powerful tool for management when analysing sales performance.

Records are held in a single table which is updated periodically (daily, weekly, monthly as required for reporting). Maintaining the data table up to date is essential if the full benefit of analysis is to be obtained. Sales Analysis reports the data in a strictly date-based form. For this reason ,the “cut-off” at the end of year is very important. Sales Analysis module will not allow records to be added (updated) beyond the end of the current year.

### *Maintaining Data*

Sales Analysis tables can hold up to 7 years of sales/inventory data. Should you wish to hold more than one year’s sales transaction for sales analysis purposes, Sales Analysis Control must be set up for multiple years – go to System Maintenance/System Setup/Sales Analysis Control. If you are unsure of the process, contact one of our Triumph consultants first.

Sales analysis has no month end procedure. It does have an End of Year rollover. Once the End of Year has been run any new records will be dealt with in the new year – again according to strict date-based reporting. How they are managed is also in the Sales Analysis Control – refer previous paragraph.

Before commencing any End of Year processing, including printing of final reports, ensure all transactions have been entered and the data has been updated to 30<sup>th</sup> June (2024), thereby completing the allocation of data to the current year.

## BACKUP


### *Checklist before doing the Sales Analysis End of Year*

a) Go to Sales Analysis Control Maintenance {S - S - A} to check and make sure the Number of Years you wish to keep the data has been set correctly. Once you have rolled over, it will clear out the earliest year’s data and include the new year’s data you are rolling into. For example: Current year is 2023/2024 and the number of years is set to 7 years, therefore the first year will be 2017/18. Once you have rolled over into 2024/2025, it will drop off data in 2017/2018 to make 2018/2019 to 2024/2025 as the 7 years you choose to hold data for Sales Analysis.

b) Go to Sales Analysis Period Set Up {D - A - F - P} to check your period table setup. Make sure you do not have any period tables marked for deletion at the time of year end process. If you have, either run the Sales Analysis deletion process {D - A - S - D} to completely remove the period table or un-flag the period table that was marked for deletion until the end of year process has been completed



Click on 'Next', flag "Confirm to Proceed with Process" and "Process".

## GENERAL LEDGER

### *End of Year Procedures*

***Be aware that some processes in the General Ledger year end may take some time to complete. It may appear that the system is not responding – do not panic. Allow plenty of time for processes to work through. If in doubt, contact our Help Desk or one of our consultants for further information.***

The General Ledger should only be closed after the 'end of year' procedures have been carried out for Debtors, Inventory, Creditors and Job Costing. Quite commonly the General Ledger is left open for a few months to enable final figures and adjustments to be entered by accountants etc. Triumph allows for this by utilising future periods. For example, if June 2026 financial year was not closed off until Sept 2026 then July 26 transactions will appear as period 13, August 26 as period 14, etc. When the year-end rollover is then done period 13 becomes period 1, period 14 becomes period 2, etc. In this example we would be able to report on July and August's figures by selecting periods 13 & 14.

Ensure all General Ledger transactions have been carried out for the year (check especially the June month). These include all payments for items that are not going to Creditors, receipts that are not entered through Debtors and all bank statement transactions such as bank fees etc. Your debtors and creditors control accounts, bank balances, purchase order accruals, BAS figures and stock and WIP figures should all have been checked in the above procedures, but it would do no harm to double check that these figures are still correct. Also, you need to check that there is no balance left in your suspense account, the transactions should all have been allocated correctly by now. Any end of year adjustments such as depreciation should also be entered before continuing.

Run a Chart of Accounts Validation {G - S - V} prior to the rollover – NB: Some Warnings are expected such as your Total Equity and Net Assets not adding to any other account, but you should not get any Errors. If in doubt, please contact a consultant to confirm.

BAS/PAYG {G - S - B} Note: if you have linked your PAYG instalment income calculation to general ledger then you the mapping will refer to periods 1 to 12 (rather than periods 13 to 18) and may need to be calculated manually for September quarter calculations.

### *GST Journals*

When we first set the instructions for GST, we deliberately split up all the different GST Accounts to allow easier reconciliation. Before completing the end of year rollover for the General Ledger it is ESSENTIAL to clear our GST Paid to the Australian Taxation Office against GST Claimed and Collected. The effect of this is that GST Claimed and Collected should reflect the outstanding amount for GST for 30 June. The journal entry would be as follows:

CR GST Paid to ATO (For total of cheques for 1st, 2nd and 3rd quarters or total for July to May for monthly remitters.)

- CR GST Claimed
- DR GST Collected

An example of this would be:

Balance 30/6/26

- Tax Collected \$ 1500.00
- Tax Claimed \$ 1300.00
- Balance 30/6/26 \$ 200.00

Journals should be entered quarter by quarter to reflect the GST balances for those quarters.

This will leave the Tax Collected and Claimed in the accounts being the balance for quarter 4 only.

## COPYING THE COMPANY

Before we close off the year for General Ledger it is essential that, as well as our regular back up, we also do a copy of our company onto our hard disk. When the General Ledger is rolled into the new financial year the General Ledger transaction history is not kept. By doing a complete copy of the company we have easy access to this information should we or the accountant require any additional reports etc.

### First step is:

## BACKUP

Once you have backed up, and labelled and stored the backup appropriately

Copy Company/Database {S - D - C} N.B. Triumph must be in single user mode

- Next to start process
- Name: e.g., Name 25/26 (year that is being closed)
- Folder: e.g., Name 202526
- Next to continue
- Type of Copy: Complete Company
- Finish to copy company

When this is copied, check that it was successful by clicking on the Company button from the menu. You should then see a list of existing companies - the one you are currently working on is highlighted but the new company (i.e., 2026 database) should also be on the list. To be absolutely sure all is well, log into the company and check the data – run a period 12 General Ledger Trial Balance to ensure the numbers are correct, and maybe the Debtor and Creditor Trial Balances which should also match the “LIVE” company.

Please note that there is a limit of ten (10) companies allowed on your normal Triumph licence. There is an ability to purchase more if required and this may be arranged by talking to one of our consultants. A block of 10 companies can be purchased

The following reports should be printed:

1. General Ledger Trial Balance {G - R - B}
  - Options: Report Period 12
  - Zero Suppress tick for Yes
  - Group By GL Account
  - Selections Keep defaults

Ensure that your trial balance agrees. That is, that your debits equal your credits for both period to date and year to date figures. Do not continue until this is correct.

2. Profit & Loss / Balance Sheet {G - R - P}
  - Options: Report Period 12
  - Report type Combined Report
  - Type of Rounding No Rounding
  - Zero Suppress tick for Yes
  - Selections Keep defaults

Check that you balance sheet balances by confirming that Net Assets equals Total Equity. If it doesn't but your trial balance did agree, then it may be that the add-to accounts in your chart of accounts are incorrect. Please contact a consultant for assistance with this.

3. General Ledger Transaction Report {G - R - T}
  - Options: Report Period 1 to 12
  - Group By GL Account
  - Selections Keep defaults

The report is often requested by external accountants. Accountants can also have access to the information they require

- On a cloud-based system – by access to a cloud licence allowing them to log on and access data directly;
- With an in-house system by obtaining a (free) “accountants” copy of Triumph into which they can download a backup (Transfer Out) of the data.

Note that, if you are required to print a copy of the report, for external accountants or for other reasons, it can be very lengthy. You can break it into monthly segments to make it more manageable. The report can be exported to a PDF format or to Excel. It can then be saved along with your other End of Year reports.

If you need any further reports you may wish to consider the powerful, simple to use, reporting tool - F9. For more information contact our office and speak to one of our consultants.

4. If you are using Budgets in your reporting you may wish to print a Budget Comparison Report {G – R - C} at this stage. Options may vary from user to user. If you are uncertain about how to achieve the outcome you want, please call.

### End of Period Processing

1. *System Backup* – this must be completed prior to proceeding.

Triumph has to be in SINGLE user mode. The backup can be processed by going to System Maintenance, Database Management, Transfer Company, Transfer Out {S - D - T - O}

Follow the prompts and ensure the correct company is selected.

Save the backup in a location that makes it easy to determine what the backup is for, in case a restore is required. Leave all other information as the default on this screen.

Click Next.

**Note to SQL users:** If the database type being used is SQL, then you will need to do a manual SQL backup prior to end of year module rollovers. Speak to your systems administrator on how to perform a SQL backup.


### 2. General Ledger End of Year - Go to {G - S - E}.

Check that Current Period Dates are Correct (Warning: Some of you may see 31 July 2023 under the Current Period Ending column if you do not usually run your end of period rollover monthly)







You can run the deletion process for as many modules as you feel comfortable processing. This will display new opening balance.

Triumph can run Budgets for the General Ledger. The Budgets for the new (2025-26) financial year can be entered manually at General Ledger/File Maintenance/Account Budget Maintenance (G-F-B) in a “spreadsheet type worksheet as shown below.

## Appendix A – Stock take

### Stock Take Procedure

It is very important your stock take is defined at the end of the last day of the year and your physical stock take completed. At this point you should check all entries for transactions relating to stock receipt or stock despatch have been entered. The key point to note here is to match the physical count to the computer records, so ensure all outstanding documentation is entered.

Note: Purchase ordering has a recent new feature to 'Park' invoices. Ensure you review the Parked invoices often to release them before the

Remember to count in the same units as your stock is recorded. Eg. If you keep an item in stock and it is measured in metres do not record your stock count in inches!!
5. [Enter Stock Take Results {I - S - S - E}](#)  
Enter your stock definition codes and, for each stock item, enter the amount you actually counted.  
  
Speak to your consultant if importing your stocktake results from excel spreadsheet or csv file.
6. [Print Stock Take Variance {I - S - S - V}](#)
  - By entering your stock take code and printing this report you are able to see any discrepancies between your physical count and the quantity held within Triumph Accounting.
  - Look for any obvious errors before continuing eg. You entered 1000 instead of 10. If any errors are found you can return to Step 4 and amend. You should then re-print your variance report as this is a record of your stock valuation at year end.
  - You can choose to report on stock variances only.

7. Make a back-up {S - D - T - O} before committing the stock take.
8. Commit/Cancel Stock Take {I - S - S - C}
  - This step is very important as no stock files are updated with your stock take information until your stock take code has been committed.
  - Be very careful if cancelling a stock take in order to re-do. If stock transactions have been entered between stock definitions then your results will differ and may be inaccurate.
  - It is important to cancel old, obsolete stocktakes. If a stock items are contained in an existing old stocktake they cannot be selected for a new end of year stocktake.

Please note the following areas for what is and is not included in a stock-take;

1. Does the stock take include POS Lay-bys or not?

The answer is it depends on whether you have the flag ticked in Inventory Control Maintenance {S – S – I}.

(note: version 6.0 and earlier have these options on the main S-S-I top screen)

2. Does the stock take include POS orders or not?

Point of Sale orders are never counted in the stocktake.

3. Does the stock take include (sales order) Picked or Delivered items?

If unticked the Triumph assumes that items on a pick slip should be added back to your 'stock on hand' figure. Ticking this assumes that items on a pick slip have been picked already and are not in the count.

Sales order deliveries are never counted. It is assumed that if they are on a delivery docket they are no longer onsite.

4. How does stock-take handle 'Goods In Transit'?

For Stock Transfer Module.

- If goods are 'In Transit' they are not included in the stock take (makes sense - if they are on a courier, how can you count them?).

Note that they are still included in the stock valuation for location 'AR' in this case.

5. Goods Reserved On Job

- Final one is if the stock is On Job. This is where the goods have been reserved for a job.

If they are "On Job" they will be included in your stock take figures as they are still on premise.

6. Extra stock items


- If you physically count stock that was not included in the stocktake list you will need to create a new stock item and then do a stock adjustment

{I – T – A} to amend the quantities and cost. Date the stock adjustment the same date as the stocktake.

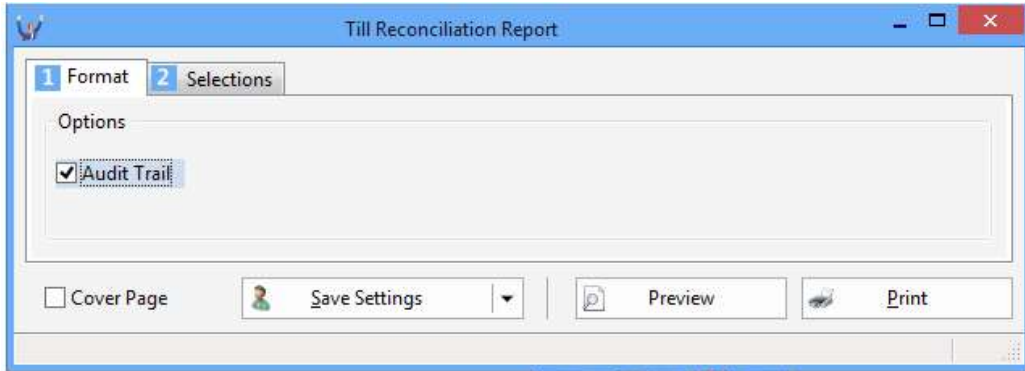

### POINT OF SALE

Point of Sale does not have an end of year process however you will need to ensure that the end of day procedure has been carried out.


- The end of day or change of shift is done in the form of rule offs.
- There is a three step process to doing cash and/or EFTPOS rule offs  
(Note: Cash = cash and cheques and credit card slips)

1. Run a Reconciliation Report {P - R - T} for each till.
  - Tick Audit Trail



Note that the docket number column allows for a drill-down to more detail (blue and underlined).
